

In the recent times, specifically in the aftermath of the worldwide financial crisis, we have been starting to observe in the Portuguese population a shift in societal behaviours, becoming united facing the several policies of austerity imposed by international organizations. The population have been driven to the abyss's verge, precariously surviving without any envision of a prosperous future, manifesting their frustration against the government's decisions, which is mostly corrupt and blatantly meanders through a system of lobbies.

"ART STABS POWER - Que se vayan todos!" is an exhibition focusing on the several policies of austerity imposed not only to countries, but its impacts in Society and in the Arts. Art has always remained a critical and conscious platform reflecting upon the local social and political issues that consequentially mirror global politics and international interests. Thus it explores the current interrelationships between art, activism and politics through several art projects. These projects use performance, installation, video, painting and objects as mediums of manifestation and/or reflection on the current austerity policies that have brutally impacted the lives of the Europeans and Portuguese people as well as the future of their country.

Concerto Brandaburguês (2004), based in Heiner Müller's text was the first collaborative performance made between **António Lago and Susana Chiocca**. After that, only in 2010 with the project *Credo* (with Igor Vasconcelos) they began to collaborate again. Since then their collaborative projects have became more intense, using it as a platform to reflect about their own circumstances, the problematic condition of their country, their identity roots and displacement. From the several projects we can highlight: A Desordem é um estado simpatico (2013, also in collaboration with Ossos do Ofício) or Derrama (2013) both projects expose the current socio-political situation of Portugal.

Beatriz Albuquerque*

Lives and works between NYC and Portugal and she is known for her interdisciplinary practices between performance and cross media. She was recently awarded the Revelation Award (Prémio Revelação), 17ª Biennial de Cerveira, Portugal (2013).
